#### Dear Parents,

Last week our school completed the External validation process. This is an extensive process to self-assess our school against the School Excellence Framework. The validation team who visited our school were very impressed with everything that is happening at Avoca Beach, both in and out of the classrooms. It was so nice to hear the feedback given from an outside perspective, about the tremendous community spirit and supportive learning environment at our school. #### **Attendance Policy**

Below is another snippet from our newly updated attendance policy.

#### **Attendance Procedures for:**

#### • students who arrive at school late

Late arrivers must go directly to the main office where School Administrative Support Staff (SASS) will enter a date, time and reason for the partial attendance and give a note to the student referring to the late arrival. If the student arrives without a parent/carer or a signed note (from the parent/carer), the partial attendance will be noted as unjustified. The note is given to the class teacher who records the partial absence and stores the note with notes received from parents/care-providers.

#### students who are required to leave school early on any school day

Parents/care-providers (or agent who carries written authority from parent/care-provider: in an emergency, this approval can be given by phone) informs SASS at the office, who will enter the date, time and reason, and collects a note which is given to the class teacher who releases the student, records the partial absence and stores the note with notes received from parents/carers.

#### changes to normal arrangements for students at the conclusion of the school day

Any change to normal arrangements for children leaving school at the end of the school day, must be notified to the class teacher in writing.

#### cases where family holidays of more than five school days are to be taken during a school term

Parents are to complete an 'Application for Extended Leave – Travel' prior to their absence (see Appendix 3). These forms are to be approved and signed by the School Principal or their delegate and returned to the parents. A copy of this signed 'Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel' approval is to be kept in the Student Record Card. If the exemption is for more than 50 school days, parents/carers will work with the Principal or delegate to apply for Distance Education (where appropriate).

#### • <u>absence explanation letters</u>

Every Monday, a SASS will generate an automatic letter to parents/carers who have not provided notes explaining absences. As per department policy, all absences after 7 days will be unjustified. This includes any notes submitted after 7 days.

#### 2020 School Travel applications now open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- · are continuing at the same school
- · are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to

https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

#### **String Performance at the Empire Bay Food and Fun Fair.**

Our string groups which included Avoca Beach, Empire Bay, Kincumber and Pretty Beach Public Schools all performed at the Empire Bay Food and Fun Fair last Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October.

We have updated our menu and added a few new mini items so the kids can make up their own snack bags. We now have carrot sticks, cucumber sticks, savoury crackers, mini cheese slices, cherry tomatoes, hard boiled eggs and pots of hummus to choose from. The popular homemade Snack Shack Burgers are making a return to Tuesdays (instead of San Choy Bow) Beef burgers are made fresh in canteen and Chicken Burgers are fresh sliced chicken marinated in garlic and grilled, there is the option to add cheese and salad items. We are also trying out homemade chocolate custard for those that like a treat now and again, the recipe is approved by the NSW Healthy Canteen Strategy. Flexischools has been updated to make items easier to read ( both for customer and people preparing) just have a read through when ordering, the main change is that toasted sandwiches are now listed as an individual item at the top of the sandwich section, hopefully this will make ordering slightly quicker too.

We will be starting our daily specials as from next week, although Nachos and Sushi will be available this week.

## **Traffic and Parking around your School**

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.



School Bus lights – buses use signs and orange flashing 'wigwag' lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors dose and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the 'wigwag' lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.



A No Parking Zone means that you must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. No Parking Zones are suitable for dropping off and picking up.









### THESE SIGNS MEAN YOU MAY STOP HERE TO DROP OFF / PICK UP

**BUT YOU MUST** 

- stop for up to 2 minutes only
- · stay within 3 metres of vehicle

Kids look to you to keep them safe - please park legally in school zones HEAVY FINES and DEMERIT POINTS APPLY

A Bus Zone means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this area outside of these times.



A No Stopping Zone means no stopping at any time.
