CAPA Day

On the 5th of November 2020, Avoca Beach Public School hosted CAPA Day (Creative and Performing Arts Day). The Day was a chance for all students in ABPS to dress in rainbow clothes and to create different pieces of art, dance, act and play games. In Stage 3, students took part in 4 activities, ranging from fun dances to creating tie-dye shirts.

One of the first activities was creating tie dye shirts. Stage 3 each received one plain white shirt, and were informed on specific steps to create a unique 'masterpiece'. While playing a video teaching us about the different ways of twisting and creating patterns with dye, Mrs Davies and Mr Mac called students over to hand over and design their shirt. A choice of dye was given to each student and then it was all up to the student to customise their blank canvas. After all student in the group were finished, bags were handed out to keep the shirt safe and protected for 6 hours. After time, beautiful and rainbow shirts were creative resulting in rainbow tie-dye shirts.

One of the four activities Stage 3 experienced was creating a rap, led by Ms Remi. After being explained about raps and songs, given examples about some young creators and had a brainstorm moment, student got to work in creating a catchy and fun rap. Themes ranged from Climate Change to Corona to Christmas, with all raps having verses and choruses. After half an hour of intense thinking, writing and practising, Ms Remi gave students the chance to perform their very own rap. With some funny, some unique and some enjoyable, the session was amusing, fun and entertaining for all students.

Another session (hosted by Ms Faunce) was dancing. Student were grouped in fours, with some being picked to choose a dance of their choice. The dance was shown on the board, with students imitating the dance; students copied of Just Dance, a fun and exhausting website. Multiple dances were chosen, some needing pairs and some dances draining students of energy. Most dances were fun, using modern music, resulting in a loud singing concert in the library.

One of the most enjoyable activities of the day was games, ran by Mr Jarmaine. The session started with the student's group being halved to play the game. Since the most popular game at the moment has been 'Among Us', students had the chance to play a real-life version of the game for half the session. As most students knew about the game, no explanation was needed to explain the rules. After half an hour of playing the entertaining game, Mr Jarmaine called student to re-group to start a new game. The new game was called 'celebrity heads', with one student being chosen to represent a character of some sort; like a plumber or doctor. Some students were given the task to put on an accent, creating laughs and giggles from all students.

In total, CAPA Day must have been one of the most fun days spent at ABPS, with student being able to wear fun and creative costumes, spend time with friends, and create and experience fun, amusing and enjoyable activities. Students show respect by observing the movement of others and slowing their own movement at exit and entry points. Bike riders are asked to show respect by waiting a little longer in the afternoon to keep pedestrians safe. All school community members show responsibility by using pedestrian crossings to arrive and leave the school, even when this means a little extra walking. We show our personal best by ensuring we enter and exit the school safely and thoughtfully every time.
