

Currently, School Banking day is Thursday.



PBL Week 3

This week our PBL focus is on how to be respectful, responsible and perform our personal best when organising notes and money. Our school expectation is that students play a role in communicating information to their families so that everyone knows what is happening. Students are encouraged to be responsible by taking notes home promptly and ensuring they get taken out of bags in the afternoon. Students also have the responsibility of returning notes to their class teachers as soon as they enter the classroom in the morning. A new routine is that any cash payments are taken to the office by the students, which can be done before school.

Building a respectful, responsible and personal best culture requires teachers, parents and students to work together. We would appreciate it if notes could be responded to by parents promptly.



PBL Week 4

In Week 4 our PBL focus will be how to be respectful, responsible and perform our personal best when transitioning around the school and using shared walkways. Our school expectations require students to transition quietly around the school in two lines so they will not disturb the learning of others. Students will recognise that walking quietly shows respect for others and fosters a calm school environment. Sharing walkways by walking carefully on the left reduces the risk of accidents. Finally, students will recognise that aiming for their personal best by being organised and leaving on time means they have time to walk safely.


