
























SPORT UPDATE - TERM 1 2020

PBL Week 7 Toilets

This week our PBL focus is on how to be respectful and responsible when using the school toilets. Students will recognise that showing respect means considering the privacy of others and leaving the toilet area clean for the next person. Being responsible for our own health means we wash our hands every time we leave the toilets. (Singing "Happy Birthday" to yourself twice while washing hands is about the right amount of time!) Our school expectations require students to take toilet breaks during recess, lunch, before and after school where possible. If a student needs to use the toilet during class time, they must always seek permission and return to class promptly.

PBL Week 8 Fixed Play Equipment

In Week 8 our PBL focus will be on how to be respectful, responsible and do our personal best when using the fixed equipment in the two playgrounds. Students will recognise that taking turns and waiting patiently is respectful to others and makes for happier play times. Taking responsibility for our own and others' safety means we wait for the duty teacher before entering the area and refrain from playing on the equipment out of school hours. Showing our personal best by using the equipment as instructed means we reduce the risk of accidents and injuries. Our school expectation is that only students in Years 3-6 use the equipment in the top playground and K-2 students use the bottom playground equipment.





Cape Three Points Road - safety concerns

We have received reports of a number of parents/carers parking their vehicles on the south western side of Cape Three Points Road as an alternative when collecting their children. These parked vehicles are obstructing the view of cars coming down the hill creating a safety issue for the students crossing the road. The safety of our students is a priority and for this reason we ask that you give consideration to the surrounding area when parking your vehicle.

- > Signatory for the P and C bank accounts

Treasurer:

Safety learning program



Traffic and Parking around your School

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.



School Bus lights – buses use signs and orange flashing 'wigwag' lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors dose and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the 'wigwag' lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.



A No Parking Zone means that you must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. No Parking Zones are suitable for dropping off and picking up.









THESE SIGNS MEAN YOU MAY STOP HERE TO DROP OFF / PICK UP

BUT YOU MUST

- · stop for up to 2 minutes only
- · stay within 3 metres of vehicle

Kids look to you to keep them safe - please park legally in school zones HEAVY FINES and DEMERIT POINTS APPLY

A Bus Zone means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this area outside of these times.




A No Stopping Zone means no stopping at any time.




Other times when you must not stop

You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following circumstances:


- Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked)
- Across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island
- On footpaths and nature strips
- On or within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing



- Within an intersection
- Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights unless signposted otherwise



- In Bus Stop, Bus Zone, Taxi Stand or Taxi Zone signed areas
- At least one metre from any other parked vehicle, close as possible and parallel to the kerb, and facing the same direction as the traffic lane



- Within three metres of any double centre lines
- Within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a bus stop

Adherence to signposting, linemarking and road rules around your school will assist in providing a safe environment for the school community and residents.
