Check in Assessments

Students in Year 5 completed check in assessments last week and students in Years 3 & 4 will complete these this week. Check-in assessments are online assessment for students in Years 3 to 9. They are mapped to the NSW Syllabuses and National Literacy and Numeracy Learning Progressions. There are two assessments:

- reading
- numeracy

Each assessment is designed to be quick and easy to administer, consisting of between 40 to 50 multiple choice questions.

The assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. All schools in NSW are required to do these now as another way for the State to also collect data on student achievement.

School Security

In light of the recent vandalism to our school, we have installed some security cameras. We really do hope that these act as a deterrent for the mindless damage that has been continuing. I would also like to thank local residents for supporting us to protect this community asset, by contacting school security when they see youths not treating the school site with respect. Before School Morning Routine

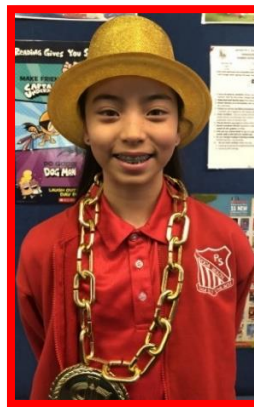
Just a reminder about some of our morning routines. If dropping students from cars at our kiss and drop area, please remain in your car and move from the kiss and drop area as soon as possible.

Supervision of students begins at 9am. Upon arrival at school, students should put school bags at their classroom and then go straight to the areas being supervised by teachers. K-2 students in the bottom playground and 3-6 students in the top playground. No child should be at school, unless they are at our before school care facility before 9am. We do understand that on some days, circumstances may require a child to be here before 9am. In this case, the students are to sit quietly on the seats outside the staffroom until teacher supervision begins.

The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

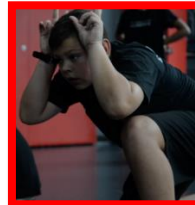
NSWPSSA Primary Athletics Championships

My name is Nami and I love my job! (and that's not a secret as everyone knows this)

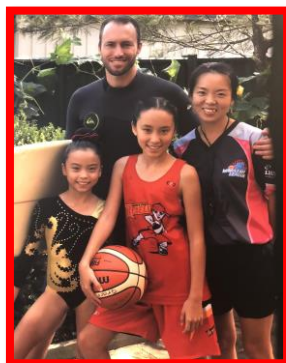

We have some exciting news to share! Thanks to our wonderful school community, with funds raised from our recent School Fair, we have been able to help the school with the following purchases over the past few months.

STEM ROOM UPGRADE

We are so pleased that we were able to contribute towards the fantastic upgrade of the new STEM room, which the students are now enjoying. The P&C funded:

- Purchase of furniture for STEM room (zen rest, seat pad trolley, 36 tote trays, pye ottoman sets, cumulus folding table, student chairs, teachers' station, active stools, foldable stem table and lab stools) – total cost \$13,875
- Purchase of robotic kits for STEM room (these kits engage students in hands-on investigation on STEAM concepts, while contributing to literacy, math and social-emotional development) – total cost \$7,000

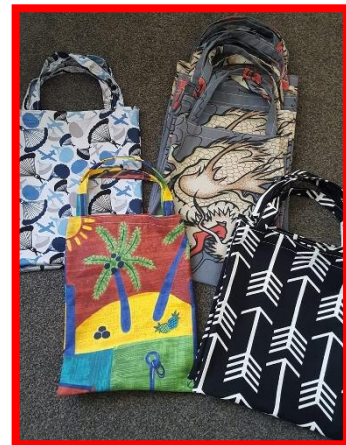

School Travel

Term 4 2022

2023 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2023 open from **Monday 10 October 2022**.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can [apply](#) now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [renew or update](#) their details before **the end of term 4**. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new [eligibility criteria](#), we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

[Term Bus Pass](#) holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note:** some R&R operators do not issue travel passes.

Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

[Travel from Term 1 2023](#)

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year. Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can [apply](#) or [update](#) details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their [local bus operator](#) to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the [Student code of conduct](#) and [Opal terms of use](#). Further information can be found at
