Dear Parents,

This will be our last newsletter for Term 2. Thank you for your support of the school throughout Semester 1. We've accomplished so much and provided a huge assortment of academic, cultural, sporting and social opportunities for the students.

Student Reports

Student Reports will be forwarded home to parents on Friday 1st July. Students from Years 1 to 6 are assessed on a five point scale in all Key Learning Areas. The gradings are: limited, basic, sound, high and outstanding. A description of each grading will be on the front of the reports. The majority of students will achieve a 'sound' grading.

A 'sound' grading indicates: The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills. Sound means they are achieving at grade level.

Students in Kindergarten have a different report which indicates their progress in meeting the outcomes of the Kindergarten syllabus.

Extra-Curricular activities

Debating, chess, choir, dance festival, enrichment days, soccer, rugby league, hockey, touch football, excursions, overnight camps, musicals, band and violin are all what we call extracurricular activities. They are not part of the compulsory school curriculum. However, they are all activities that help to shape our students, allow them to have broad experiences and excel in a range of areas. They develop self-esteem, build confidence and provide a rich source of engagement for students. It is important to remember that our school provides a very wide range of these opportunities and it only happens due to the hard-working teachers, who are willing to put their hand up to take on the extra duties. I want to acknowledge Avoca Beach teachers for all that they do, above and beyond their job description, to support the wholistic development of the students at our school.

Air Purifiers

The Department of Education provided the school with some air purifiers last year. Thanks to our P&C, who spent \$4,500 to purchase another 8 purifiers, we now have one in every classroom and learning space.
