Community Connections Art Show Silent Auction – Greg Jarmaine Original Painting


The family of Greg Jarmaine have donated a painting to support our upcoming Community Connections Art Show. The painting is valued at \$1100, and will be up for silent auction at the art show. All proceeds will go directly to our Community Connections Foundation which is used to support families in need within our local community.

Greg Jarmaine spent more than forty years as a professional artist. He had a distinctive style that art lovers Australia-wide adore and collect. His understanding of perspective, colour and light, along with his handling of oil, acrylic and watercolour paints came naturally, and was a regular part of his life. Since his first solo exhibition in 1980 his artwork has been in popular demand throughout Australia as well as in the UK and America. He hosted over 35 solo exhibitions throughout his career.

Greg's subject matter ranged widely, covering a full spectrum from coastal beaches to country homesteads, local street scenes and exotic international boulevards. A hallmark of almost every artwork is Greg's custom of leaving out certain modern structures, transporting the landscape back in time to create nostalgic views which hark back to fond memories. Predominantly working with oil and acrylic paints Greg developed a modern impressionistic style, creating detailed paintings with swift brush strokes.

Staff Profile Karen Munton

Are you really a "Karen"? Yes, I've been a "Karen" my whole life.

OK, so now to give the parents some information about yourself Karen. Where did you study? Straight after leaving school, I was fortunate enough to receive a scholarship to study Primary school teaching. I went to Sydney Teachers College which was in Camperdown. About 10 years later, I also completed a Further Diploma in Special Education in Johannesburg. Where did you begin your teaching career? Straight out of university I began day to day casual teaching in the inner- city suburbs of Sydney. Every day the phone would ring and I would travel to a different school and teach a different grade. Those days were hard. As a young, inexperienced teacher most days were just surviving and longing for the bell to ring. What came next? After a few years of this, I donned a back-pack and headed to London. I was away for 3 years, travelling and working. It was the most amazing time seeing the world, making new friends and teaching. I taught in the east end of London and that was certainly an eye opener. Once again it was day to day casual teaching and I longed for a job where I could make connections with the children in my care.

You mentioned you studied in Johannesburg? How did that come about? On the slopes of St Ulrich in Austria, I met my husband to be. He happened to be South African. I went to live there, got married and had 2 boys. I was there for 11 years. During this time, I worked in a private school called Crossroads. This was a school for children with learning difficulties. Their motto was "Let none be left behind", and this epitomised the way I taught. It was here that I developed my passion for teaching children with learning challenges. I also grew to love the African bush, and more than anything, this is what I miss. Sitting around a fire with the whoop whoop howl of the hyena in the distance.

But you now live and work in Avoca Beach. How did that happen? Once our boys were old enough to go to school, we decided that we wanted them brought up in Australia, where they would have more freedom and opportunities. The stars all aligned and we came to live in this amazing community. I feel so grateful that it where we call home.

When did you start working at Avoca Primary?

I was permanently employed as a Learning and Support Teacher in 2005. I shared days between Kincumber and Avoca. I now work at Avoca 4 days a week in this role.

How do you feel being the oldest teacher at the school? Firstly, I don't know how that happened. I don't feel old. But, I do get asked a lot when I intend to retire and the only answer I can give is.... not YET!

Do you have a mantra that describes your teaching ethos? Yes. I have a few. "If a child can't learn the way we teach, then we need to teach the way they learn." "Children may forget what you said to them, but they will never forget how you made them feel" and something that I always say to children is "You don't know how to do that.... YET"

What do you like to do outside of school? My very best time is family time, with the new addition of "Charlie Munton". I love walking my dog and drinking coffee (or gin and tonics) with friends. I try hard to surround myself with people who make me laugh.

I would like to end with a huge THANK YOU to all the parents. Thank you for your beautiful children, because without them our school would not be the best school on the Central Coast. It is always a privilege to come to work and teach in a school where the staff are dedicated and supportive and the parents value education.

Unfortunately the new jackets have been delayed and will not be in until October. If you have any questions, please let me know.


