OSCH Update

It has been extremely upsetting to come back to school and find out that the OSCH service did not operate over the school holiday period and is still not in operation. I have been in contact with the School Infrastructure Asset management team, who are responsible for before and after school services, to try and get some answers moving forward. Below is the latest response. I will keep communication and updates coming as I receive them.

Dear Ben,

Thanks for your email, please find some information below to answer your questions. We are currently working with Big Childcare to understand whether they will return to your school site and what the options for care are for your school community, which may involve a tender process. Regarding the transfer of BASC Vouchers, if Big Childcare confirms they will not be returning to operate the Avoca Beach PS service and many families transfer across to Copacabana OSHC and want to use their vouchers at this service, the Department can contact parents to gather interest and facilitate a transfer of vouchers to this service. Please note the Department will wait to confirm the next steps of the service before transferring any vouchers. Thank you for your patience, I hope to provide you with an update as soon as I get some more information. 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Voluntary Contributions

Our voluntary contribution fees will remain the same for 2023. The fee is set at \$43 per student or \$86 per family. These contributions go a long way to supporting our school to provide high quality educational programs for every student. Last year we used these funds to upgrade our library computer lab and turn it into an engaging STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) space for all students to participate in future focussed lessons. This year we will use funds to go towards the upgrade of student toilet facilities and purchase of resources to support the new English and Mathematics syllabus.

Uniform

Our first PBL focus for 2023 will be on uniform. Uniforms give students a sense of belonging and enhance pride in their school. Wearing a uniform shows unity and identity. In much the same way football followers will wear their team's jersey or scarf, a uniform builds a sense of community. Students will engage in lessons around school uniform throughout the week and we will remind them what the correct uniform is. Please support the school in encouraging the wearing of full school uniform each day. A particular focus will be eliminating the wearing of oztag/footy shorts and Santa Cruz socks.

Our school uniform shop is open Thursdays from 2.30pm to 3.30pm.

Attendance

As mentioned at our information nights, we want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school. One way we can help make this happen is to be sure your child attends school each day unless they are sick or are absent for a justified reason.

Protecting the wellbeing of our students through the reporting and monitoring of student absences is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools. Notifying the school either before or on the day that your child is away helps us keep accurate student attendance records to support you and your child. **We encourage you to notify the school of all absences using our school app, a handwritten letter or a phone call to the office.** As a further measure, to eliminate unexplained absences, we will be sending a reminder text message if your child is absent and we have not received an explanation already. You can also reply to these messages to provide an explanation for an absence.
