Welcome to Week 6!

I can't believe we are already halfway through the term. This week, I would like to acknowledge the hard work of our amazing teachers. Not only have they been busy getting to know all the students in their classes and prepare lessons for each day, they have also been participating in a range of professional learning activities before and after school. This year, we are particularly focused on the quality teaching of Mathematics and the introduction of a new English and Mathematics syllabus in K-2. As such, the teachers have been engaging in a range of activities to improve and hone their skills in delivering engaging, innovative and explicit lessons. The extra time and effort they have put in already this year is simply inspirational. Our students are certainly in great hands!

Director Visit

Last week the Director of Educational Leadership, Kylee Owen, and Tim McCallum (Executive Director, School Performance), came to our school to see and hear about the wonderful things we are doing. They had an opportunity to tour the school, visit classrooms and talk to students and staff. I was so proud to showcase what we are doing here at ABPS and both Mrs Owen and Mr McCallum were enthralled with what they saw. Mr McCallum sent a lovely email following the visit, stating, "I was highly impressed with the staff who are re-shaping their pedagogy to deliver the new K-2 curriculum with expertise and energy."



NAPLAN

Starting from Wednesday 15th March, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN. NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

It is important to note that NAPLAN is a one-off test that provides a snapshot of learning. It is imperative that we do not put undue pressure on our children to perform in these tests. Teachers see on a daily basis what their students can and cannot do, and they modify their teaching accordingly. Due to this they have a much better understanding of your child than what a one-off test can give you. Please reassure your child that NAPLAN is not something to be worried about. We encourage them to have a go and try their best.

School Photos

Our annual school photos will be held this term on **Tuesday 28th March.** Further information will be sent home with student envelopes later in the term.

Voluntary Contributions

Our voluntary contribution fees will remain the same for 2023. The fee is set at \$43 per student or \$86 per family. These contributions go a long way to supporting our school to provide high quality educational programs for every student. Last year we used these funds to upgrade our library computer lab and turn it into an engaging STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) space for all students to participate in future focused lessons. This year we will use funds to go towards the upgrade of student toilet facilities and purchase of resources to support the new English and Mathematics syllabus.

Attendance

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can impact your child's learning more than you think. When your child misses one day a week over a year, that's 40 days of school, 8 weeks of lessons and 2.5 years over their school life lost. As your child's education has already been interrupted through periods of learning from home due to COVID-19 over the last 2 and a half years, now is the time to prioritise face-to-face learning and making the most of every school day. Avoca Beach Public School strives for the expected attendance rate which is above 95% of students at school each day over the year. Your child's attendance rate is measured by the minute, so arriving late to school and leaving early will also affect this rate.

Online permission notes

In the interest of minimising paper and looking after the environment, we have been attempting to do more of our permission notes online. This is a new system, and we are still working out the bugs. To help the office staff, when completing permission notes that require a payment, we ask that you please complete the permission and payment at the same time. This will help to avoid confusion and the need to follow up with families. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

- \cdot To record the minutes, along with reports, publish and distribute to members and attending individuals of P&C meetings
- · To keep an up-to-date list of all financial members
- · To collect correspondence received from the school office
- · Signatory for the P&C bank accounts

Executive Member: (includes office bearers and up to 6 other members)

- · Responsible for ensuring decisions made by the P&C are adhered to and acted upon
- · Meetings just for the Executive can be called by the President, or a Vice President in the absence of the President between general meetings should urgent matters arise
